EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING COVID-19

THIS ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER is being issued in response to the pandemic outbreak of the Coronavirus Disease 2019- (COVID-19).

Although for many this disease appears to cause only flu-like symptoms it can pose a serious and potentially lethal risk as exhibited by the increasing number of California deaths currently attributed to the disease. On March 17, 2020, the Morongo Tribal Council passed Resolution No.031720-02, Tribal Emergency Declaration for COVID-19 Virus Pursuant to the Morongo Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan and the Stafford Act (the Resolution). The Resolution temporarily closed or required only essential functioning of all Tribal Administration departments and offices from March 17, 2020 until the Tribal Council takes further action to end the declared state of emergency. California Governor Gavin Newsom also declared a state of emergency in California on March 4, 2020.

Given the significant number of identified and projected cases of the disease in

California, the severity of the risk posed to the public, and the state of emergency declared

by the Morongo Tribal Council, the current situation demands immediate action by the Court. NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby – **ORDERED** that effective immediately and until further Order of this Court the following:

- Pursuant to Morongo Tribal Council Resolution No. 031720-02, the Court will
 only hear matters of an urgent nature beginning on March 17, 2020, until May 10,
 2020. This date may be revised depending upon the status of the COVID-19
 public health emergency.
- All pending cases that do not have any urgent issues that need to be addressed are continued and will be rescheduled to a later date by the Court Clerk.
- 3. The Morongo Tribal Court will hear all matters of an urgent nature, including emergent issues in Ordinance 9 violations, and urgent issues that arise in guardianships or conservatorships.
- 4. All time frames set forth in the Morongo Tribal Code that are applicable to any court proceeding, patron claim, or tort claim are suspended effective March 17, 2020 to May 10, 2020. This date may be revised depending upon the status of the COVID-19 public health emergency.
- 5. Should the need arise for a hearing, the Court will conduct telephonic or video hearings, in all cases without exception, regardless of the health of the parties, attorneys, or other participants in order to minimize the number of people attending court in person. The Court has the capability to connect attorneys and parties on video/conference call.

 6. The Morongo Tribal Court continues to accept emailed pleadings, motions, and reports. These documents can be emailed to tribal court@morongo-nsn.gov .
