EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING TORT CLAIMS

Previously, this Court issued Emergency Administrative Order No. 4 tolling any time requirements for the processing of tort claims until July 31, 2020.

Specifically, the Court ordered that all time frames set forth in the Morongo Tribal Code that are applicable to any court proceeding, patron claim, or tort claim are suspended effective March 17, 2020 to July 31, 2020. The Morongo Casino is now able to process tort claims. NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby - **ORDERED** that –

- All time frames set forth in the Morongo Tribal Code that are applicable to any court proceeding, patron claim, or tort claim will resume effective August 1, 2020. The time period from March 17, 2020 to July 31, 2020 will not be included in the calculation of any time periods set forth in the Morongo Tribal Code.
- Trial dates will be addressed at scheduled pretrial conferences.
 Scheduling of trial dates may be impacted by the public health emergency presented by the COVID-19 virus. If a pretrial conference is not currently
