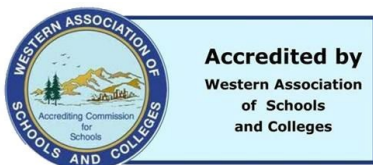

In Fall 2026, Morongo School will serve approximately 130 students from Preschool through 8th grade across three campuses. A new school campus is scheduled to open in January 2027, serving students in Preschool through 5th grade, including two Special Day Classes designed to support students in special education. Middle school students in grades 6th through 8th will continue to be served at a separate campus location.
